  - antidotes the effects of all anesthetic vapors
  - trauma, surgery
  - hemorrhages
  - prostration after injuries
  - it follows China after hemorrhage
- 2. Allium cepa [8]
  - neuralgic pains (like a long thread)
  - post amputation pain
- 3. Arnica Montana [9]
  - a traumatic injury
  - cerebral congestion
  - angina pectoris
  - to prevent post-partum hemorrhage and puerperal complications
- 4. Belladonna [8]
  - fevers
  - hemorrhage
  - wounds
  - inflammatory conditions
- 5. Hamamelis virginica [8]
  - · venous hemorrhages
  - wounds
  - traumatic inflammations
  - · chronic effects of mechanical injuries

- to relive the discomfort after surgery on varicose veins and hemorrhoids
- 6. Hypericum perforatum [10]
  - remedy for nerve pain
  - side effects of laparotomy
  - pain and ailments after fall on coccyx
  - to prevent or treat tetanus
- 7. Millefolium [9]
  - hemorrhages from bowels, uterus
  - incarcerated hernia
  - post surgical disturbances
  - often useful after stone removal
  - prevents post-partum hemorrhages
- 8. Ruta graveolens [9]
  - bone and periostal pain in and after surgery
  - carcinoma affecting lower bowel
  - it will ease discomfort and promote recovery after surgery when involving tendons, cartilage, connective tissue, coverings of the bones
- 9. Staphysagria [11]
  - for deep, painful and profusely bleeding wounds
  - meibomian tumors
  - chronic tonsilitis
  - haemorrhoidal tumors
  - post surgical (neuralgic) pain
- 10. Veratrum album [9]
  - collapse or shock from injuries/surgery
  - postoperative shock with cold sweat
  - weakness, prostration after injuries
  - when there is icy coldness of the body after fright
